from the CEO

Dear Friends,

One of the things that makes the Center for Transforming Lives unique is the strong relationships we develop with the women and children we serve. Knowing them as individuals helps us move past their biggest barriers: lack of safe housing or child care and financial instability. When we work side-by-side with them – the outcomes are astounding.

This year at Center for Transforming Lives, 91% of women in homeless services remained stably housed after program completion, and women enrolled in economic mobility services saw an average increase in income of \$2,481. For the older children enrolled in our full-day, year-round early education, 87% are Kindergarten-ready (three-year average).

The formula is clear: when women and their children have access to trauma-informed, dual-generational services like ours, we can break the cycles of poverty and trauma and create cycles of well-being.

Over the past year, CTL has continued to grow. We safely housed more families, acquired a new early childhood education center on East Lancaster, and launched an effort to open economic mobility centers. These economic mobility centers will combine financial strengthening services with small business development, allowing women entrepreneurs to have access to coaching, capital and community.

Most rewarding, we've seen our impact deepen in Tarrant County. Our outcomes show how effective we are; and as our footprint expands, so will the ripple effect on our community.

However, the need in our community is immense. There are still more than 200,000 women and children living in poverty in Tarrant County. The gap between available services and the number of women and children in need, at times, seems daunting.

But, we're up for the task. It won't happen overnight, but we envision a future where every woman and child who faces poverty has access to services in Tarrant County. We can't do it alone.

With your continued support, CTL can work to close the gap. Together we can transform our community as we help more women and their children move from poverty to prosperity.

Thank you for your partnership and for being so deeply invested in transforming our community.





The Center for Transforming Lives helps women with children move from poverty to prosperity through homeless services, free early childhood education and economic mobility services.

Homeless Services

Denishia worked with a CTL case manager to move from a homeless shelter to a safe home in 2018. Today, her twins are enrolled in CTL's full-day, early childhood education so Denishia has time to work and provide for their family.

Latoya shows off her first set of house keys after experiencing months of homelessness. On move-in day, CTL staff and volunteers ensured Latoya had the household essentials, such as a bed, sheets, paper towels, and dishes, to make the apartment a home. CTL operates a 24-hour, on-site homeless shelter for single women, providing both an emergency and a more intensive, longer-term shelter option. For homeless women with children, CTL works to rapidly re-house families in off-site, safe and affordable homes. After several months of intensive case management, counseling and job-readiness, these women are independent, working and paying their own rent.

Economic Mobility

One-on-one financial coaching is a core component of CTL's economic mobility services.

CTL integrates housing and child development with individual financial coaching, education and career advancement. By creating pathways to economic mobility with women, CTL helps families disrupt their cycle of poverty. Financial education and healthy money management can pave the way from poverty to self-sufficiency. Our financial education equips participants to increase their income, credit scores and savings, and decrease their debt.

Early Childhood

CTL's early childhood education programs are expanding to reach the most vulnerable in society. With four child care centers and three partner sites at locations throughout Tarrant County, CTL is caring for and educating record numbers of children. Last year, high-quality affordable early childhood education was provided to 392 children. Nearly 70 percent received these services for free or at a reduced cost based on their income. Increasing the school readiness of young children, the program also serves a critical need for parents. While the children are in our care, CTL connects parents with education opportunities, and job training and employment options that help create pathways to economic mobility.

Education

CTL Acquires New Child Care Center

Delighted, joyful and hopeful are feelings most parents associate with the beginning of a pregnancy.

But for 17-year-old, high-schooler Melissa Martinez, news of her pregnancy triggered fear, followed by anxiety and immense determination.

"Scared, so scared," Melissa remembers of that time. "How was I going to care for a little person who would be completely dependent on me? I was still in school, but suddenly making money had to be my first priority. I didn't want my baby to miss anything he may need."

Melissa started working in the fast food industry, putting in long hours and extra days, trying to save enough money for the baby's arrival. Forced between making an income or finishing high school, Melissa faced an impossible choice when her son, Leo, was born.

Then Melissa learned about Texans Can Academy, a non-traditional high school with consolidated hours that allows students to work **and** finish high school. But who would take care of baby Leo?

Fortunately for Melissa, CTL had just formed a new partnership with Texans Can Academy, providing on-site child care to high school students and the local community. Melissa could continue her education **and** work, while Leo was cared for and nurtured at a child care facility operated by CTL.

"It is an *all-in-one*," she said. "If it weren't for CTL, so many teen moms would have to drop out of school. Without the child care option, we couldn't go to class."

The unique partnership between Texans Can and CTL started in 2018, then expanded in 2019 when CTL assumed the day-to-day operations, management and fiscal responsibility of the center, located on East Lancaster along the homeless corridor in Fort Worth.

With new staff, curriculum and quality standards in place, CTL is significantly impacting the lives of these young children – 100% of whom are from families with teenage parents or families experiencing extreme poverty and homelessness.

With the addition of the Lancaster Center, CTL is now serving 374 children daily in seven child care centers throughout Tarrant County. The powerful, two-generation approach to breaking the cycle of poverty ensures children are educated and parents are supported, improving the economic mobility of the entire family.

Leo, now 19-months-old, likes singing and books, and especially loves going to school with his mom each day. Melissa will graduate high school in June 2020 and plans to pursue a Child Development Associates Certificate.

"Through CTL and Leo, I learned that I really enjoy early childhood education. I want to teach."

Melissa no longer wakes up scared. She has created a new life - one with a bright future.
