






Center for Transforming Lives partners with single mothers and their children so they can thrive. To disrupt the cycle of poverty, Center for Transforming Lives applies a two-generation framework of essential services that stabilize families and help them reach financial and emotional well-being.

PROGRAMS



HOMELESS SERVICES

Center for Transforming Lives moves women and their children quickly off the streets and out of shelters into community-based housing. Case managers provide an array of wrap-around services to create safety and long-term self-sufficiency, including rent assistance, employment and education support and health care access.



CLINICAL COUNSELING SERVICES

Center for Transforming Lives' Clinical Counseling Services are dedicated to the emotional well-being of women, children and families through a person-centered approach to process trauma and manage the daily stressors of life. Through the counseling program, women and their children are treated by licensed therapists who provide evidence-based, trauma-informed individual, play and family therapy.



EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Center for Transforming Lives provides high-quality, affordable, year-round education at three child development centers and partners with other childcare centers throughout Tarrant County. As a Head Start and Early Head Start provider, Center for Transforming Lives is able to extend the reach to serve even more children and families living in poverty.




ECONOMIC MOBILITY


