
Children Experiencing Homelessness Presenting in Shelters in Tarrant County


- Nationally, approximately **one in three** people who experienced sheltered homelessness in 2017 were in families with children.¹
- According to the 2018 Point in Time Count data from the Tarrant County Homeless Coalition, **one in five persons** (21%) in emergency shelter were under age 18.²
- According to the Tarrant County Annual Homeless Assessment Report, among families experiencing homelessness during 2017, **3 out of five** persons in families using emergency shelters were children.³
 - Among these children, **one out of ten children** were less than a year old (11.4%) and **four out of ten children** were less than 6 years old (44.6%).³



• Between 2012-2017, 44-50% of children in shelter were under the age of 6 years (Figure 1).³

- In 2017, among families experiencing homelessness in shelter, 70.3% of persons were family sizes of 3 people or more. Similar proportions were reported for years 2012-2017 (ranging 63%-78%). In 2017, over a quarter (26.6%) were in family sizes of 5 people or more (Figure 2).³
- Young children represent almost half of the children presenting in the shelter system in Tarrant County.
- Young children experiencing homelessness are vulnerable for other adverse childhood experiences, including abuse, neglect, and exposure to violence.⁴
